McDaniels Marsh: Cynthia reported that NH Fish and Game has acquired a lot of approximately 60 acres that adjoins the land they currently own around McDaniels Marsh.

Outreach:

- OHD: CC members brainstormed ideas for the CC table at Old Home Day. The hope is to be able to create several displays, using maps and photos to show the locations and interesting features of the town owned lots, hiking trails, etc. Marla, Marilyn, and Daphne volunteered to be on a subcommittee to work on this.
- KRHS community service project: Amanda Chase and Eric Anderson from KRHS contacted Marilyn to let her know there won't be a botany class this fall, but they know of a student who is interested in doing her senior project related to identifying trees and other plants on one or more of the town lots. Nik Coates, executive director of NHACC, has told Cynthia that there is a statewide push to do more in schools regarding conservation and ecology. Cynthia will be meeting with him on the 12th to give him more information about some of the programs she was involved with in schools over the years.
